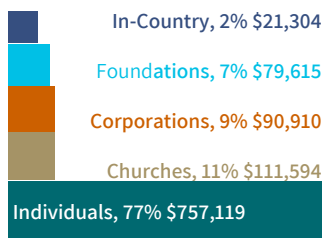

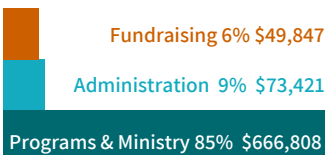
2021 Revenue

YEAR IN REVIEW - 2021

Challenges

The pandemic affected our ministries in various ways, and some more than others. With governmental shut downs, some programs were put on hold in 2021 for short periods of time, while others forged ahead. Children in our Haiti and Zimbabwe programs continued to receive food, sometimes in the form of food kits versus cooked meals. Continued economic and political unrest made it more difficult for ministry leaders and staff to reach and serve those in need; however, each worked to make a difference in the lives of those they served. Burkina Faso experienced continued extremist violence against Christians throughout the country, forcing the Mobile Clinic to be selective in where they could serve. Haiti endured violence due to political unrest and kidnappings. Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe gradually opened up. Due to the pandemic and in-country violence there were no short-term teams in 2021.

Joys

The ability of our in-country staff to adapt and find new ways to continue in ministry is one of our greatest joys. Both the vocational school students in Burkina Faso and Haiti held gradations. Children continued to be fed in Haiti, Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe. Pastors in Zimbabwe were able to attend leadership training, and the children in the Our Kids program returned to school. Although pastors in Haiti could not gather for the annual leadership training, they continued to share Jesus, baptize and teach the Gospel. Leaders in Burkina Faso stepped up to the challenge of serving during violent times by reaching out to camps and enrolling young women in the Village of Opportunity. The Single Moms Raising Sons ministry shared Bible studies with single moms and invited fatherless sons to attend camp. We are grateful for God's provision and protection!

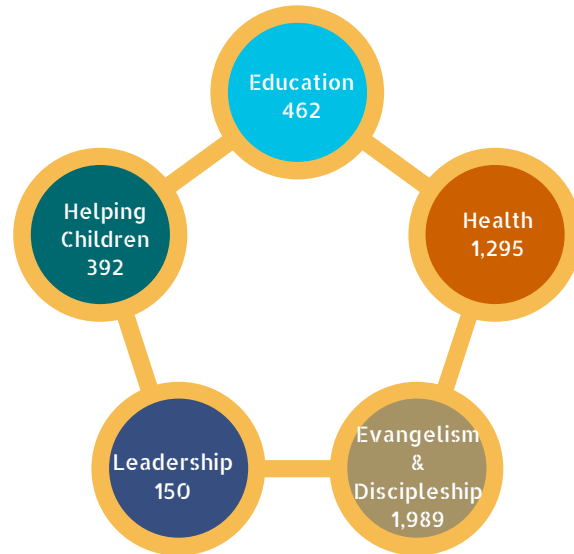
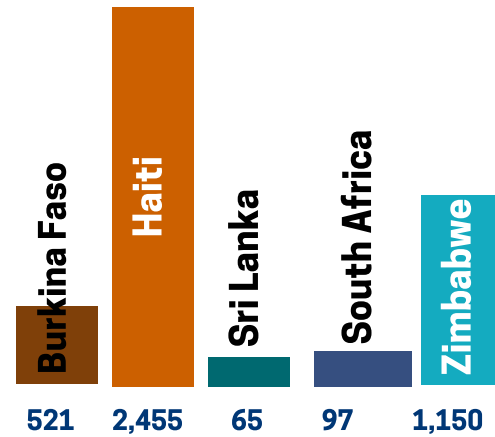
