

YEAR IN REVIEW - 2021

Challenges

The countries where we serve are no longer seeing significant negative impacts from the pandemic. Yet, the most challenging aspects of ministry in 2022 were the frequency and far-reaching effect of in-country violence. Haiti continues to operate with virtually no government leadership, gangs have overpowered much of the country and inflation has severely impacted many families. Extremist violence and para-military activity make life in Burkina Faso both dangerous and uncertain. Political volatility in Sri Lanka made travel more challenging and sharing the Gospel more difficult. Zimbabwe's rate of inflation was astronomical. Some programs were put on hold for a time due to violence. We were again unable to hold evangelism and leadership training in Haiti or host short-term teams to any countries. Ministry obstacles are not new to CWO. Our priority remains to keep our staff and those we serve as safe as possible.

Joys

We continue to be amazed and grateful for the way our in-country staff serve and care for people in areas of great danger. Although some classes in Haiti had to be put on hold for a time, both vocational training graduations in Haiti and Burkina went as planned. Children continued to be fed in Haiti, Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe. Pastors in Zimbabwe attended leadership training, and the children in the Our Kids program attended to school and were well cared for. Even in times of great fear, pastors in Haiti continue to baptize church members and reach out into their communities. The Burkina Mobile Clinics served in remote areas with many Muslims and refugees, where some accepted Jesus. Ministry in Sri Lanka expanded into more locations. The Single Moms Raising Sons ministry offered more Bible studies while more boys attended camps. We are grateful for God's provision and protection!


